#### **Dr. Geraldine Branch**

No one is more qualified to deliver a lecture series on wellness than distinguished physician Geraldine Burton Branch. A new Hollenbeck resident, Dr. Branch will soon celebrate her 103rd birthday.

In the fifth grade, she wrote an essay saying

that she wanted to become a doctor. Her classmates scoffed. "You're black, and you're a woman," they said.

Dr. Branch proved them spectacularly wrong. She earned her M.D. at New York Medical College in 1936 and a Master's Degree in Public Health at U.C.L.A. For 60 years, she excelled in obstetrics, gynecology, public health, preventive medicine and academia.

In gratitude for the support she received as a student, she established a four-year scholarship to her alma mater. "All I had to do was make good grades and behave myself...I feel like God helped me and I should pass it on."

Dr. Branch remains passionate about health and helping people. She was delighted to learn about Hollenbeck's Lifelong Learning program and within weeks of settling in at Hollenbeck joined the speaker calendar. Topics she has presented include "Attitude and Recovery," "Healthy Sleep," and "You Are Never Too Old to Learn."

Dr. Sunoo was Distinguished Professor of Political Science at Central Methodist University, teaching there for 30 years, and Professor of Political Science, UC Irvine. From his youth to the present, his passion has been the reunification of Korea, and he was instrumental in the dialogue between North and South Korea. He has authored 26 books in four languages on subjects ranging from political science and history to language and poetry. When Dr. Sunoo is at the podium he is in his element. He lectures on a variety of topics such as "What's Wrong with the American Economy" and "Development of Democracy from Plato to the Present."

## We Welcome New Residents

GEORGE NAKASHIMA is a California native. With a natural talent for all things technical, he built a successful 25-year career



in aerospace, working for Douglas

Aircraft and Hughes Aircraft. George marvels at how his life ran parallel to that of his wife June for over 10 years before they met. Their path began in Pasadena where they both attended Pasadena Junior College (now, Pasadena City College). Then history intervened, and they were

incarcerated with their families in Gila River, a World War II camp for Japanese-Americans in Arizona. They were both later moved to Cleveland, Ohio. During all this time, they never met. Years later, they were finally introduced to each other by a mutual friend. George and June were married for 52 years and lived in Monterey Park until her passing in 2008.

George is a traveler, avid golfer and longtime fan of college and pro football, not to mention the Lakers and Dodgers – when they are playing well!

After exploring several options, George knew right away that he wanted to live at Hollenbeck. "It was almost a snap decision," he recalls. "It wasn't a difficult choice." He particularly enjoys Hollenbeck's bingo and tai chi classes. Not one to leave his technical savvy behind, he stays connected with his nieces and their families via email

JOE RODRIGUEZ a San Diego native, worked for 38 years in the Navy Department of Defense, where he supported the research and development of naval ships. He retired in 2006 and joined the Hollenbeck

community a few months ago.

## Dr. Kanegae – Exceptional Medical Director and Caring Advocate

**T**r. Thomas Kanegae, Hollenbeck's Medical Director, brings rich Dexperience and impeccable credentials to his work. But his long list of accomplishments doesn't begin to tell the story of what this extraordinary physician means to the lives of his patients.

Dr. Kanegae's passionate dedication to his calling is evident in all he does. "It's not unusual for him to turn a life around," says Camille Goldsmith, Director of Nursing at Hollenbeck's Hensel Hall. "He doesn't give up. For example, we had a wheelchair-bound patient whose condition had been declared irreversible. That person is

now walking."

Even though Dr. Kanegae is in high demand at his busy hospital practice, he makes himself available to any Hollenbeck patient who needs to see him. In emergencies, he gives bedside care to prevent the person from having to go to the emergency room.

Under his direction, Hollenbeck's already highly-skilled nurses perform advanced technical interventions that far exceed procedures offered at most skilled nursing facilities. As a result, fewer patients are transferred to the hospital, and medical conditions are caught before they develop into emergencies.

Dr. Kanegae thinks so highly of Hollenbeck that he often refers outside patients to Hensel Hall for a temporary Medicare Rehabilitation stay, finding the care here superior to some hospitals. Tami Ruris Kanegae, his wife, also works here, assisting residents as a Wound Care Consultant. They regularly refer people to Hollenbeck who are looking for a retirement community.

A whiz at following music on the internet, Joe seems the ideal candidate for establishing his own blog or website on his musical specialties.

Hollenbeck's central location supports Joe's other main interest as well – sports. He's a fan of baseball, football and hockey. He enjoys the food and camaraderie at Hollenbeck, and can't say enough good things about all the Hollenbeck Staff.

**SAMU TO** grew up in Los Angeles. His school years unfolded in a typical way until the advent of World War II. While still in junior high school, he was relocated to an internment camp in Wyoming for Japanese-American citizens.

Isamu rose to the challenge. What might have been

ordinary – just another boy earning his high school degree – became extraordinary against the backdrop of the times and this enormous disruption to his young life. A modest man, Isamu himself sees nothing notable in this accomplishment.

After the war, he shipped off as an Army interpreter and was stationed in northern Japan, the site of the

recent devastating tsunami. Returning home in 1948, he

attended college. Stalwartly navigating a difficult job market, he went to work for the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power. "They told me the job would last a year," he says. Instead, seeing his potential, his employers promoted him. Thirty-two years later, he retired.

Isamu has made four trips to Hawaii with the single purpose of playing golf. On one trip, he and his friends played nine rounds of golf at nine different courses in just 10 days.

Isamu moved to Hollenbeck four months ago. "Everyone is very friendly," he says. "The employees bend over backwards to help you."
