Bang the Drum Slowly

Emmylou Harris adored her dad. In her eyes he hung the moon and lit the stars. He fought in World War II. After his death years later she wrote a song in tribute to him: "Bang the Drum Slowly," which has now become in the eyes of many the most beautiful WWII song ever written.

In November we reflect on all the men and women who gave their lives for our country, and our world in the several wars in which our citizens so bravely fought and died. We are here because of the ungainly ragtag armies of the American Revolution and the Civil War. We remember the boys of World War I and those who after Pearl Harbor dropped what they were doing and enlisted, often without even asking their parents first. We think of the men who died in Korea. We remember Vietnam, the war which finally made us think hard about those sent to fight and to be ever grateful to all who wear the uniform no matter where they go or what they do, and to thank them. We think of all the men who slogged through muddy fields and bone dry deserts hungry and wounded but who still moved on rescuing and preserving inch by inch, life by life the lands of the free, the homes of the brave. We think of those who flew the dragons of the sky to clear the air for songs of liberty. We think of sailors who strode the mighty seas so that we could frolic and cavort, leap and dance in the waves. We think of

the women at home who in unprecedented numbers marched to munition factories to arm these brave men; the 350,000 women who enlisted and supported our troops overseas; the women of the Red Cross who built hospitals overseas, or who here at home created packages to send our soldiers.

We remember. We give thanks.

Outside of Washington, DC, is Arlington Cemetery. Its citizens lie in silent testimony to the need to preserve and defend that which we hold so dear: the United States of America, the land of the free and the home of the brave.

We think. We pray.

Thank you to those here in our community of St. Joseph John Knox who fought during wars for freedom or, while not on the battlefield, put your shoulder to the wheel and worked for liberty here at home or abroad.

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From the Executive Director

As I re-read what I wrote last month, I realize we were right in the throes of preparations for the hurricane. Now, as I reflect on the last 30 days, I am so thankful for our good fortune during the hurricane. We never

lost power. I was sure we would, and believe me, I was never so happy to be wrong in my life! My sincere appreciation to all of our staff who went out of their way to make sure our residents felt safe and secure. It was really more than that; it was just family taking care of family. I am proud to work for an organization that has such high standards.

It has been a crazy month around here as right after the hurricane, five surveyors from the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) came to do their annual survey. They are required to come annually and have a three-month window on either side of a year. Usually (at least during the last 11 years), they come in the very last month, but this year they were two months early! We strive to be survey-ready every



day of the year, but we all know we are on high alert when we are in our "window". I am happy to report that we are definitely survey ready every day! The Med Center team did a fabulous job and they left with only two tags, both of which

were minor and not related to patient care. Kudos to the team in the Med Center, and the food service, housekeeping and maintenance staff that support them! We celebrated with them at the Fall Family Festival in late October.

Since there were some tragedies on the other side of the state during the hurricane, Governor Rick Scott has imposed a rule that all nursing homes and assisted living facilities must have generators to keep the air cooled to an ambient 80 degrees, along with enough fuel to last for 96 hours. The current rule is that all critical care outlets, refrigeration and life safety be generated for 72 hours. We must be compliant with this rule in 60 days or we will be fined \$1,000 per day per facility. Well, it is impossible to

get that kind of work done in 60 days, so we are applying for a variance to not comply with the period. My thoughts are that it is the right thing to do, we just need more time.

This may be repetitive, but we still have not heard from our auditor with the State of Florida Office of Insurance Regulation. He was here in August for three weeks, working on the triennial audit. They are still not ready to give me an exit report, so when I get it, I will give you an update. Nothing surprising came up in the audit; I will report any issues and they will be posted in the main lobby document case.

We will continue the presentation of the different departments each month at my coffee. This is an effort to help residents get to know team members as well as services offered and vice versa. We celebrated the Social Services department in October; come and see who is on for November!

Thank you for being the wonderful residents you are and for the opportunity to serve you.

November and Things To Remember

The air has a chill, the new moon aglow and here we are in November of 2017. First of all, thank you to each of you for making the flu shot process a huge success.

As we reflect on the things that we are thankful for, I can list so many that a forest of trees would be needed to provide the paper. November holds so many memories and days of recognition such as, the end of hurricane season,(I don't know about you but that makes me thankful), Veteran's Day, National Alzheimer's Month, American Diabetes Association Month, and so on.

But out of all of these there is one that every person who is a Medicare recipient needs to know and that is that it is Open Enrollment time for Medicare. I just want to give you some pointers to assist you or try to lead you in the right direction.

I know it can be very overwhelming, and all the help you can get is rewarding. First, please make sure to do your homework if you plan to change your current plan. It is important to find out whether your current physician is still on the plan you are selecting or staying with since the new elections won't start until January 2018. Even though that doctor may be on the plan in 2017 does not mean they will continue to be in 2018.

Please research the plan and the benefits that would be awarded to you and make sure it meets your healthcare needs. If you need more assistance in your decision you can call 1-800-Medicare to see which plans are available in this area and use that information to gather information unique to you and your needs.

Medicare D which is the pharmacy plan falls under the same advice. Your local pharmacist may be able to help you by providing a list of plans that cover specific medications that not all plans cover. Open enrollment ends on December 7, 2017. By now most of you should

have received your booklet from Medicare showing updates for 2018.

You can also visit the website at CMS.gov for more information. I hope that this brief note helps you glide through this process smoothly and that everyone has a very Thankful November.

Tuesday, November 28, 2:00 p.m. in the PDR


