The first festival was supposedly held sometime during the Middle Ages.

The origins of the celebration do not appear to be well documented. Legend has it that a student of the college was wandering in the forest of Shotover, some say around Christmas time, reading Aristotle, when a wild boar attacked him. In order to save himself, the young man rammed his book down the throat of the beast exclaiming, 'Graecum est' (It is Greek) and the boar promptly expired. The scholar then severed the head of the beast and triumphantly carried it back to the college where, one can assume from subsequent events, they feasted upon it.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

There is a most important word that is lacking these days in our current personal and political vocabulary: *HUMILITY*.

From the White House, to the State House, to the "News" House, to the Club House, to some of our Own Houses, there is a famine of humility in our culture. Too many voices are claiming, "I have the voice of God. My way is right, so your way must be wrong."

It is this dominance of arrogance that is contributing to the dividing of our nation and the world into a destructive culture which demonizes anyone who might not share our complete belief or value system.

Oh, how easy it is to become entwined in a sinister web of despair, cynicism, and antagonism which can drag us all into a pit of negative fatalism and despair. How refreshing and inviting when someone dares offer a humble statement of, "I might be wrong, so let us talk."

There is a healing world view I would offer. We are entering a season in Judaism, Christianity, and Islam which trumpets a reminder to each of us that "THERE IS A GOD, AND WE ARE NOT IT!"
