


Hendersonville Public Library Seminar on LEARN HOW TO ACCESS DIGITAL RESOURCES ON YOUR PERSONAL DEVICES

Popular bandleader Guy Lombardo started the song's holiday tradition in 1929, when he played it at the stroke of midnight during a New Year's Eve broadcast from New York City.



Join us Friday, January 11 at 3:00 for a presentation by Dr. David Ellis, Chief Medical Officer at Pardee Hospital, speaking about Opioids: Past, Present and Future.

The Works of Michelangelo by Ari Landau

This two part series will begin with Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel Ceiling on Wednesday, Jan. 16th at 2pm in the Theater. In 1483 Pope Sixtus IV conducted the first Mass in his newly constructed private chapel in St. Peter's Basilica. The Sistine Chapel is used by the Roman Catholic cardinals to elect each new Pope. In 1508 Michelangelo was commissioned by Pope Julius II to paint the Sistine Chapel ceiling. In 1512, after fifty-four months of arduous labor, the world's most magnificent fresco was completed. Our journey will enrich and inspire us as we are absorbed by this wondrous human masterpiece.

The second presentation will be on Wednesday, Jan. 30th at 2pm in the Theater and will focus on Michelangelo Buonarroti, who lived for 88 years from 1475-1564. He was a sculptor, architect, painter, poet and engineer, a genius equal to Leonardo da Vinci and Raphael. We will enjoy his artistic creations: The Pieta, David, Holy Family (Doni Tondo), Moses, Medici Tombs, St. Peter's Basilica Dome and the Sistine Chapel's *Last Judgment* fresco. Come join us for a fascinating trip.
