The Lost are Found Too

One day three hunters went into the mountains to hunt and while they were in the wilderness it began to snow. It snowed so hard that they lost their way until they discovered a line fence and followed it to a line shack. After knocking, a woman opened the door bringing them shelter, warmth, and food.

She and her son lived on the hills caring for sheep. The blizzard went on for three days and one of the hunters spent time with the young boy and taught him the 23rd Psalm. To help him remember the Psalm by heart he used the fingers of his hand for the first words of the psalm...THE..LORD...IS...MY...SHEPHERD.

She answered, "Some time after you left another blizzard hit hard and he went to search for one of the lost sheep on the hillside. When he did not come home, I went in search of him and I found him. He had found the lamb and I found him lying on top of the live lamb with his hands in a strange position. He was holding his little finger and the hunter knew he was holding onto the word Shepherd. THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD!

The place we call Ecumen Parmly LifePointes is not a church where evangelism is conducted. It respects the religious heritage of everyone. Nevertheless, it is holy ground where many people lost in the shuffle of life come to dwell in their twilight years. Our mysterious God works in his unique way to find the lost and encourage the faithful.

Recently a Vietnam veteran came to live at Parmly by his choice. He was placed on Hospice and was not expected to live long. His first priority was to call for a chaplain. Arriving at his room he asked, " I grew up believing but I was never confirmed; is it too late for me to go to heaven?"

Through subsequent discussion and prayer he confirmed his belief in Jesus Christ who suffered and died for him on the cross. From that day forward until his death only weeks later he lived with joy and peace. He was one of the lost that was found by the Lord's mysterious grace.

Through various means of support from people in the community, we care for those who come to us in need of medical help, therapy, physical and cognitive care, and also seeking spiritual wellbeing.

Dignity Walks Honor Veterans By Playing "Taps" with a new Bugle

hrough an interdisciplinary approach involving nursing, social services, spiritual care, and environmental services staff, Parmly developed and implemented "Angel Care" in 2005. Services provided through "Angel Care" evolved adding the Dignity Walk and Dignity Quilts in 2007 and 2008.

In October 2015, Chaplain Ron Miller of the American Legion Post from Forest Lake contacted Pastor Ron Gerl with a donation of a large American flag for veterans' dignity walks in place of the dignity quilt at the Parmly Residence. With the increase of veterans at Parmly, it seemed more appropriate that the Dignity Walk should honor the veterans for their service to our country.

The flag, donated by the Post and Robert's Family Funeral Home of Forest Lake was graciously accepted along with the flag holder, donated by Grandstrand Funeral Home, Lindstrom and used for "Parmly's Dignity Walk" tradition on October 27, 2015 for the first time.

Shortly after the flag was received the Parmly Honor Guard was formed. Residence veterans volunteer to serve as the Honor Guard. The Honor Guard assembles during awake hours, escorting and saluting each veteran as they leave Parmly.

This past fall, the Family of Lloyd Goble presented Parmly with a memorial donation dedicated to the Parmly Honor Guard who now have hats and purchased a ceremonial bugle. In addition to escorting and saluting veterans as they leave Parmly, the Honor Guard pays tribute by playing "Taps."

Angel Care was created to acknowledge impending death and to accommodate the wishes of the dying and their families. "We come into this world with so many people surrounding us and showing love and appreciation for us," says Parmly Chaplain Ron Gerl. "Angel Care is

designed to bring that same dignity and celebration of a person at the end of their life on Earth. We are especially proud to honor our veterans with a flag and bugle."
