Campaign Co-Chairs, Connie Stauffer and Elvin Kraybill, unveiled the final campaign number - \$3,451,588, which far surpassed the original goal of \$2.6 million. High Learning & Wellness Center and Crossings apartments included a time to reflect on the history of the ground on which this building now stands and to welcome the local officials who joined us for the event.
