They harvest in the morning for that day's deliveries giving the chefs a fresh product. Many places receive two deliveries a week meaning the lettuce is generally enjoyed within





# Exercise: A Promising Treatment for Dementia?

We know that moderate-intensity exercise, such as brisk walking, can improve thinking skills and slow their decline in older age. A trio of studies presented at the July 2015 Alzheimer's Association International Conference suggest that



aerobic exercise may even be able to help protect your brain from Alzheimer's and other dementias, and improve your quality of life if you have the disease.

One study of 200 adults with Alzheimer's showed that those who engaged in three hour-long exercise sessions a week for 16 weeks had less anxiety, irritability, and depression and better mental speed and attention compared with those who didn't exercise. A study of 65 sedentary older adults with mild cognitive impairment showed that those who took part in 45 to 60 minutes of aerobic exercise four times a week for six months not only had better attention and planning skills, but also better blood flow to the brain and a reduction in dangerous proteins associated with Alzheimer's disease, compared with those who only did stretching exercises. A study of 71 older adults with cognitive impairment due to vascular disease found that those who did an hour of aerobic exercise three times per week for six months improved their thinking skills, memory, and attention compared with those who did not exercise.

Opportunities for aerobic exercise at The Cedars include classes such as water aerobics, Cardio and Core, TGIF and Retro Dance and use of the treadmills, elliptical, stationary bicycle and NuStep in the fitness room. For those who prefer to exercise outside, try walking and cycling around The Cedars campus and the Meadowmont neighborhood.

# We Are All Made of Stardust: Cosmic Furnaces and the Origin of the Elements

with Christian Iliadis Thursday, November 1, 3pm Ballroom

Humans consist mainly of oxygen, carbon, hydrogen, nitrogen, and calcium. But



where exactly were these elements created? And where did all the other elements come from? The story of element synthesis involves the work of 12 Nobel laureates and will take us from astronomical objects (stars) to unimaginably small particles (atomic nuclei), from nuclear fusion to neutrinos to the weird world of quantum mechanics. Christian Iliadis is the J. Ross Macdonald Distinguished Professor and Department Chair of Physics & Astronomy at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and a nuclear astrophysicist at the Triangle Universities Nuclear Laboratory. He was awarded the prestigious University of North Carolina Board of Governor's Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2014, and he is the author of the textbook Nuclear Physics of Stars.



#### Blackbeard's Sunken Prize

In 1717, the notorious pirate Blackbeard captured a French slaving vessel off the coast of Martinique and made it his flagship, renaming it Queen Anne's Revenge. Over the next six months, the heavily armed ship and its crew captured all manner of riches from merchant ships sailing the Caribbean to the Carolinas. But in June 1718. with British authorities closing in, Blackbeard reportedly ran Queen Anne's Revenge aground just off the coast of what is now North Carolina's Fort Macon State Park. What went down with the ship remained hidden for centuries, as the legend of Blackbeard continued to swell in the public's imagination. When divers finally discovered the wreck in 1996, it was immediately heralded as a major find in both maritime archaeology and the



history of piracy in the Atlantic. Now the story of Queen Anne's Revenge and its fearsome captain is revealed in full detail. Books will be available for purchase.
