Being Neighborly

(an excerpt from Rev. Hathaway's sermon from July 8, 2018)

There's a new documentary out right now about "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" and Fred Rogers' ministry, and I've seen it twice in the last two weeks. Mister Rogers' gentle invitation—*Won't You Be My Neighbor?*—is so needed today. Among interviews and other clips, the old reels of footage taken during Fred Rogers' encounters with some of his biggest fans—little children—and the way he invited them into his world, assuring them that he loved each and every one of them "just the way they are" is precious—and provocative.

The kind of hospitality that Fred Rogers showed children is sacred—its holy—indeed, it's the hospitality of God. Everyday, we are given opportunities and faced with choices that are invitations to partner in God's kindness and compassion, in God's abundant hospitality.

Think about it, here at Newbury Court. Think about how much your actions matter to your neighbors, the staff, visitors to the campus. Think about how you greet one another, and try your best to remember or ask everyone's name. Think about how you pray for one another, or visit each other when you are in hospital or rehab. Think about how you support one another by gathering at celebrations of life for your neighbors and friends. Think about how you offer you take the time to notice and have genuine concern for the employees of Newbury Court, the folks at the desk, or in the hallways, or who visit your suite. Think about how healing it is to be acknowledged, noticed, welcomed. Everyday, you respond to God's invitation to welcome and bless your brothers and sisters, neighbors and strangers, in incredible ways.

May we bring hospitality and healing wherever we can, our hearts humming and voices echoing the inviting words of Mr. Rogers:

*I have always wanted to have a neighbor just like you,
I've always wanted to live in a neighborhood with you.
So let's make the most of this beautiful day,
Since we're together, we might as well say,
Would you be mine?
Could you be mine?
Won't you be my neighbor?*
