HELPFUL INFORMATION! New Jersey Identification Cards

If you do not have a driver's license, a New Jersey identification card can be used to prove your identity.

You can use this card for things such as opening a bank account, voting, and traveling. You **cannot** have an identification card and driver license at the same time. If you have a driver's license, you must surrender it to the NJ MVC when you apply for a NJ identification card.

At the request of Lois Meyers, Michele Musto, Volunteer Coordinator, contacted NJ MVC and learned that they **do not** offer a mobile service any longer. Application must be done in person. You **cannot apply online or by mail**. Cards are valid for 4 years and cost **\$24** (American Express, MasterCard, VISA, check, money order, or cash) The MVC Agency is located at 6725 Black Horse Pike (Shore Mall) Egg Harbor Township.


