DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

"For it is in GIVING, that we RECEIVE," said St. Francis of Assisi. Words that ring true here on our campus. We closed strong in 2015 with over \$1,153,000.00 in gifts contributed from less than fifty resident, family, friends and staff donors. This is a triumphant milestone for us. One which has single handedly launched us into 2016, our 50th golden anniversary year, with the following accomplishments:

Impact on our mission:

- Mortgage is paid off entirely and we are now debt-free.
- Annual funding to support the library.
- Gifts to grow the Development Fund Endowment, which provides 'charity care' for select residents who outlive their financial resources.
- Gifts toward infrastructure and capital projects to maintain the integrity of our aging campus.
- Funding towards programs and services in the Dammert Care Center.
- Gifts to underwrite new devices, equipment and programming in chapel and high rise building.
- Gifts to support the general operating budget. These are gifts of extreme value to the Apartment Community. General Operating budget gifts allow the leadership to determine where to spend the gift based on the greatest need.

Dammert Geriatric Center Embraces Electronic Health Records

Dammert Geriatric Center has made the commitment to move ahead with embracing technologies to further drive our quality of care and staff performance. We chose BlueStrata EHR as our software model.

BlueStrata is user-friendly, and staff training has been easily incorporated into the daily routine. The use of electronic health records (EHR) improves resident safety, allows caregivers to document accurate and "real time" resident care, and improves productivity allowing caregivers more time to focus on our residents.

Implementation of the software began late November 2015, and we plan to be completely "paperless" in early January 2016. The software model offers a full collection of charting, careplans, physician orders, interdisciplinary assessments, and clinical reporting. The Dammert Geriatric Center will now be able

to participate in properly capturing residents care to ensure we are meeting today's standards. The accuracy and quality of medical record documentation will improve communications with physicians and outside facilities.

We're thrilled about this movement and look forward to continued success as we benchmark quality assurance of our excellent care!
