A Word from the Administrator

Collectively our residents have lived 4,543 years. Those years comprise a lot of experience, resulting in a lot of wisdom. The residents have contributed so much to our society in so many ways. Think of what they did for their families, their churches, and their country. One interesting contribution by a resident who used to live at Parkview is lettuce. You got it . . . Lettuce.

Former Resident Amelia Schini carefully saved lettuce seed from the prior year's crop every year of her life—even when she was living at the Village. She obtained it from her parents or grandparents who brought it with them from Alsace Lorraine in the 1800's. One dreary March day she showed me how to press the seed heads between one's fingers, and blow the chaff away. It was called Three Heart Lettuce. It is a category of lettuce called buttercrunch, producing 7" open heads. We had it for supper again last night, and it is tender, crunchy and delicious.

We sent some of the seed to the heirloom seed company Seed Savers Exchange in 2005, and this year they marketed it in their catalog. Look it up and see its picture on their web site www.seedsavers.org or find it on page 32 of their 2013 catalog. Other gardeners from the Apostolic Christian communities also saved the seed. It can now be purchased at Seed Savers.

Thank you Amelia, for all of your contributions to our world. And thanks to all of our residents for similar things you have done in ways big and small throughout your long, rich lives.

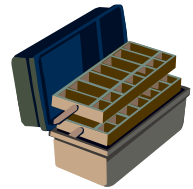

NEEDS & WANTS

Lotion (scented and regular), holiday door hangings, gum (they like Extra), Breath Saver or Cert type mints, sugar free chocolate (especially mint patties), little Debbie type cakes, bite size packs of cookie & snack mix, pocket Kleenex, eye glass cleaner wipes, stamps, women's perfume (no Musks), bobby pins, body mist sprays and body wash. Presently we **DO NOT NEED** men's cologne or deodorant, loofas and bubble bath.

The colored washcloths are used for our warm scented washcloth program. Parkview uses colored washcloths as this distinguishes apart from the white washcloths that are used day to day. The colored washcloths are rolled and put in a crock pot that is filled with warm water and for lunch time fresh citrus is used (oranges, lemons, limes or grapefruit) sliced with juices squeezed on the cloths; in addition, for supper a relaxing or comforting scent (lavender, spearmint & eucalyptus) is used. The washcloths are used nine to eleven times each week and some are getting a little thin. The washcloths that are holding up the best are the thicker washcloths.

Do you have a 30 cup coffee maker that you are no longer using? Recently our 30 cup coffee maker has decided to no longer perk it will heat but not perk so we have been brewing the coffee in the 10 cup maker and pouring into the 30 cup for the coffee hours each week. Let us know if you have a coffee maker that needs a new home like Parkview Haven.

Parkview Haven has an outdoor shuffled board but it needs to be repainted as the course is worn and barely able to be seen. Parkview Haven does have the pucks and sticks. If you are interested in giving of yourself to paint the shuffleboard court we will welcome your help!

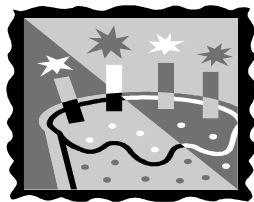
