More Chicks Coming this Spring!

Spring is quickly approaching, a time of renewal, rebirth, new life. The Backyard Chicken Project and Neighborhood Gardens at Pine Village will be ready to begin their third year! What started as a trial in 2014, has grown into a yearly tradition. From seed to table, incubator to outside chicken palace; the excitement continues.

In 2015, these projects were expanded to the Meadowbrook courtyard thanks to the Holly Moran Consumer Wellness Grant. The grant provided funds to purchase another chicken tractor and build another raised garden. Our 2015 Meadowbrook chickens even made front page news in the McPherson Sentinel, including the beloved chicken named "Carmel" with demeanor more like a friendly dog than a chicken!

This year we will add more chicks to our brood. Eggs will be set in the incubator mid-March. It takes about 21 days for the eggs to hatch, which will be sometime in April. The chicks will be put in the brooder, and then moved outside to the chicken tractors in May. The incubator and brooder will be located in the Wellness Center and we encourage residents, staff, families and the community to visit often! It's going to be another EGG-citing spring!

Residents and staff will also help get the raised gardens ready for spring planting in March. From March to November we will plant, pick, watch, wait, water, weed, harvest, prepare and eat. All food from the Pine Village gardens is raised chemical-free.

Pine Village Wii Bowling Team Wins National Championship

The Pine Village Strikers won the 2015 Fall National Senior League Wii Bowling Championship! The team of Merle Schmidt, Marjorie Schmidt, Arthur Krehbiel and Virgil Goering (*pictured below*) had a total of 16,799 points and perfect average of 300!

"The team has always been just shy of the championship in past tournaments," said Catina Pitts, Pine Village Life Enrichment Coordinator, "But they practiced many hours this season, and it paid off!"

The team competed against 1,563 individuals making up 295 teams from 99 retirement communities in 30 states! Additionally, Merle and Marjorie were named Wii Bowlers of the Year with both carrying perfect scores during league competition – not an easy accomplishment!

The National Senior League Wii started in 2009, when former Olympic handball player and coach, Dennis Berkholtz, was disappointed in the lack of activities at his parents' senior community. The NSL coordinates state, regional and national tournaments that allow teams from retirement communities to compete against each other via the Internet.

Merle Schmidt has been on the Pine Village team since joining the NSL in 2012. Schmidt has continued to improve and work on his technique during the off season.

"I enjoy the competition of the NSL," said Schmidt. "It's also a game of skill, which I like to work on."

The team was featured in the McPherson Sentinel and the Hutchinson News. Following the release of those articles, team member Virgil Goering passed away unexpectedly. A celebration was held on December 22 on the Pine Village campus, where the team was honored, along with Virgil posthumously, with his wife and family being present.
