

He picked her up from work one evening, slid over to the passenger side and said, "you're learning how to drive us home tonight". After Kansas City they moved back to Springfield where they bought the Springfield

Office Machines business. Jean and Sidney adopted a baby boy they named Daniel, who passed away in his early adult years. Jean and Sidney were married for 63 years before he passed away from a long-lasting illness. After Sidney's death Jean's second cousin Jan, moved her from Springfield to Wichita to move into KMH. Jan chose KMH because her mother (Jean's cousin, Francis Lauer) was a resident here and they wanted to live together again. Sadly, Francis passed away two months before Jean moved in. Jan lives in Wichita and comes to visit Jean guite often, which Jean is very grateful for.

Jean is a woman of many talents and hobbies. She started taking roller skating lessons in high school and continued to skate competitively well through her fifties. She also took dance lessons later in life and did performances at multiple




locations, including many nursing homes. Jean taught herself how to paint and all the artwork hanging in her apartment is her own work. She enjoys going to the pool to exercise with Anne and other residents at the KMH swimming pool. Jean has an organ in her apartment that she used to play regularly, and still plays every now and then.

When asked what her favorite thing about KMH is, Jean said, "I like that I have my own apartment but can still go out in the other areas to interact with people. It's also nice that we have doctors here that come to us if we need them, instead of having to leave the building for a visit".

The Twelve Days of Christmas starts on Christmas day and ends on the eve of The Epiphany, January 5th. The verses of The Twelve Days of Christmas start with "my true love gave to me," which represents

On the first day God gave a partridge in a pear tree. The first day of Christmas is December 25th and the partridge in a pear tree represents Jesus. The second day the gift is two turtledoves. These represent the Old and the New Testaments. The third day is three French hens, which symbolizes faith, hope, and love. The four calling birds are the four Gospels; Mathew, Mark, Luke, and John. Five golden rings are the first five books of the Old Testament, which are also known as the Hebrew Torah or Pentateuch. The six geese a-laying represent the six days of creation. The seven swans a-swimming reference the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit (prophesy, serving, teaching, exhortation, generosity, leading, and mercy/compassion. Romans 12:6-8). January 1^{st} is the eighth day and the gift is eight maids a – milking, symbolizing the eight Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3 - 10). Nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Galatians 5:22 - 23). The ten lords a-leaping are the Ten Commandments. Eleven pipers piping represent the eleven faithful Apostles. The final day is twelve drummers drumming, which symbolize the twelve points of the Apostles Creed. The Twelve Days of Christmas was written in the 1700's; a time of severe religious persecution, as a catechism song. This was sung so that people could honor the many gifts of God without fear of persecution or arrest. So, when you sing this song remember the meaning behind it and how fortunate we are to live in a place and time that we can

worship and demonstrate our faith without fear of persecution. Merry Christmas and may you have a blessed time with family and friends.
