Eastern Phoebes —by Alice



Cheerful and restless little birds, Eastern Phoebes, are in no danger of being over looked by spring birders. Returning in early April, these brown and white tiny birds, plump their tails up and down as only Phoebes can do. The males perch among the leafless trees and announce themselves to everyone within earshot by endlessly repeating their name: "fee-bee, fee-bee, fee-bee!"

Their nest is a tiny cup shaped of moss and mud pellets attached to a support on a sheltered ledge near water. Females lay 3-8 tiny white eggs. Incubation is 14-16 days. The young leave the nest 15-17 days after hatching. Their food is insects and spiders, captured in flight.

When I lived in Cottage #6, two Phoebe birds built a nest on a ledge fastened on the wall of the nursing home and I was so lucky to watch them as the female laid eggs. Both parents fed the babies until they flew from the nest. I never told any-one here about the Phoebe birds.

At first I thought about writing about St. Patrick's Day, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, or Easter Sunday, but it was just too much material. So, I decided to write about the Eastern Phoebe, one of God's little gifts to us!


