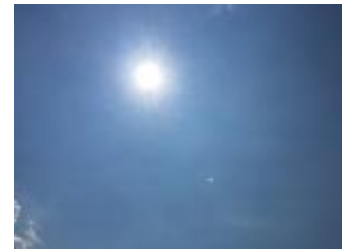

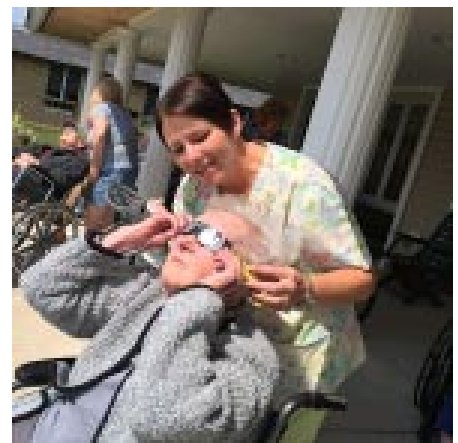
SOLAR ECLIPSE

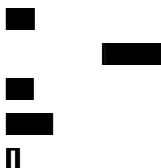

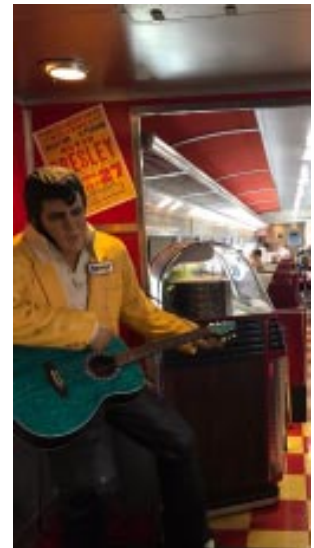
Krysten Mauthe, CNA was the lucky winner of August's guessing game. Her jar was filled with salt water taffy.
