Eloise Pifer Rice is seen here performing with her choir, The DuBois Vocal Ensemble. If there is one thing everyone wants to hear around the holidays,




it's beautiful Christmas music. It's just one thing we can't seem to get enough of, and we appreciate the many groups who take the time to entertain us.


