New Harvest House Will Double Memory Support Personal Care Availability at Homestead Village

arvest House will open by the end of the year, and it will greatly increase Homestead Village's ability to meet the needs of older adults who would benefit from memory support services. Situated on the second floor of the Westvue building, directly above Gelhard House Harvest House will offer thirteen private rooms with full baths, a living room, dining room, kitchen, sunroom, and outdoor deck. Harvest House residents will also have easy access to the outdoor gardens, gazebos, and patio areas at ground level. With the opening of Harvest House, Homestead Village will double the number of residents it can serve in memory support personal care from thirteen to twenty-six.

Life in Harvest House should duplicate the wonderful environment our team has created in Gelhard House. Gelhard House has the feel of a refined and pleasant home filled with caring family members who



just happen to be residents, staff, and pets. One exciting aspect of the Harvest House project benefits Gelhard House. The addition of the sunroom upstairs will create a covered outside porch off of the dining room. The new covered porch will significantly expand outdoor recreation opportunities for Gelhard House residents.



The Harvest House project has many components that have enhanced Homestead Village. To create the needed space, many staff offices were relocated earlier in 2018. Administration and Accounting joined Human Resources and Development in the new office suite at The Bachman Center, which received an all-new sound system, new carpet, bathrooms, emergency exits, and lighting as part of that renovation. Other staff relocated to two new office suites in the main building where the spaces were redesigned to be more efficient and provide additional meeting and
