Several leadership staff from Bethel attended a nationally recognized dementia care training in October learning valuable tools for providing highquality care to residents experiencing dementia.

Bethel Lutheran Home's top priority is to ensure every resident receives the best care possible. Individuals experiencing dementia symptoms have special care needs. "This training taught staff alternative techniques and methods to improve quality of life for residents and reduce the unnecessary use of anti-

psychotic medications," said Stacie Thompson – Director of Nursing.

The training and certification is valuable, timely and vital for care providers due to the growing statistics of these symptoms and recognition of resources to aid families, healthcare and residential healthcare providers. Currently Alzheimer's and related Dementia is the 6th leading cause of death in the United States and the 5th leading cause of death in South Dakota. (Source -2018 Alzheimer's Fact & Figures Report)

The Dementia Training was provided by Great Plains Quality Innovation

per person and can be prepaid in the office or paid at the time of the meal. We ask visitors to sign in on the meal sheet in dining for an accurate total meal count for each meal.





This fall, window air conditioners were covered and several windows required

new caulking to help eliminate wind drafts. During the summer, we rebuilt two heating circulation pumps in the nursing home facility that will help maintain





through seasonal maintenance so it is ready for use on Bethel streets and parking lots. The maintenance crew also uses two snow

> blowers and many shovels to help maintain the sidewalks and egress areas for the entire Bethel Community.

Indoors we keep the fire burning to warm the facility

and heat water with the use of seven boilers.
Staff gain training to help ensure safety through continuing education.

Lonny Stoltenberg attended a one-day course at Lake Area Technical Institute on safe boiler operation and maintenance in October while team maintenance members, Rhonda Myers and I gaining certification in 2017.

Bethel Participates in "Table Top" Disaster Exercise

Bethel Lutheran Home participated in a Lake County "Table Top" Disaster Exercise along with representatives from the Madison Regional Health System, Madison Care and Rehab Center, city and county elected officials and several local area emergency responder agencies. Stacie Thompson, Director of Nursing and I attended.

Director Kody Keefer of Lake County Emergency Management led the discussion. A tabletop exercise provides the most efficient way to test

and improve the effectiveness of an organization's crisis plan and their crisis response team. Professional analysis of the exercise provides the crucial information needed to determine how well an organization would actually respond and continue functioning in a crisis, as well as examine how their plan and response team may be improved. There are four Table Top Drills or actual exercises planned for 2019. Bethel will continue to participate.

"We are grateful staff had the opportunity to participate in the Dementia Training. This type of training offers broad benefits." Thompson added. "As staff put this knowledge into practice, we expect to see a positive impact for residents and families throughout our community."

The nine topic areas addressed in the Dementia training ranged from communication and feelings to spiritual care and end of life. Dementia care is just one of the many quality improvement efforts addressed within the nursing home collaborative facilitated by the Great Plains QIN. Nursing homes unite to share quality improvement tools, knowledge and experiences to provide residents reliable, compassionate and high-quality care.

LaVonne Gaspar, Long Term Care Consultant & Bethel Lutheran Home **Interim Nursing Home** Administrator, serves on a statewide task force to develop a South Dakota Plan to address Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia (ADRD). A Needs Assessment included input from 1,172 South Dakota residents regarding ADRD care in South Dakota. The individuals represented how ADRD is experienced: from family caregivers to professional caregivers and from individuals living with the disease to those who have experienced firsthand the loss of a loved one to the disease.

Currently, South Dakota is one of four states without an ADRD state plan. The work group determined this as a very important measure for development and approval of a state plan to recognize this as a critical need.

Continuum of Care Endowment

The Continuum of Care Endowment (CCE) was established by the Foundation for the purpose of providing long-term care assistance towards the operation of Bethel Lutheran Home. The Bethel Foundation Campaign gift solicitation and pledges began in the fall of 2015 after seed money of \$200,000 to initiate the plan was received in 2014 from the George Jorgensen Estate. The Bethel Foundation added additional money to start

the endowment with a total of \$250,000.

Solicitation of pledges and CCE gifts began in the fall of 2015. The original goal was to secure 50 one-time gifts of \$5,000 or more, with a pledge payment schedule for up to a period of five years. However, we realize that everyone has different gifting abilities; therefore, the Foundation is open to a broader approach to reach our goal of \$500,000 pledged and gifted to the

Endowment by 2020.

Currently our Continuum of Care Endowment Pledges total \$371,443. Since November represents the end of the third year of the CCE Campaign, we are at 74% of our goal. For this endowment to do what it is intended through perpetuity, the amount still needed is \$128,557.

We ask you to prayerfully consider joining this campaign to raise half a million dollars for the Bethel Community to sup-

port enhanced quality of care through recruitment and retention of competent staff, necessary updates and increased resources to preserve the mission of Bethel "Sharing Christ Through Caring Service."


