

She was invited into an academic honor fraternity, qualified quickly for a better job, and made plans to attend college full-time studying social work. Ebonie now mentors new residents at The Ebby House who arrive as she once was: scared, battered and resistant to rules.

Celebrating 125 years – thank you for your support!



In 1892, author J.R.R. Tolkien and American actress Mary Pickford were born. Also in that year, Thomas Edison received a patent for the first two-way telegraph and the first Sherlock Holmes stories by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle were published. It was the first year women students were admitted to Yale graduate school, Ellis Island began welcoming immigrants to the United States and The Nutcracker ballet with music by Tchaikovsky premiered in St. Petersburg. The world received many glorious gifts in 1892. Juliette Fowler Communities was one of them!

Juliette Fowler Homes for Children and the Aged was chartered as a nonprofit organization in the state of Texas by Sarah Peak Harwood in 1892, and named for her visionary sister, the late Juliette Peak Fowler. The homes were built on land that Juliette had purchased in February 1889 before her untimely death in June of that year. Because of her foresight to (cont. on page 3)

create a will, Juliette's desire to care for orphans and widows was fulfilled. In 1903, Sarah aligned the homes with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) which created a relationship that remains today.

The "old folks home" evolved into retirement living, assisted living, memory care, skilled nursing and rehabilitation following hospitalization.
