High Tech Therapy Tools Build Motivation and **FUN** at Fowler

John came to Fowler for rehabilitation after being hospitalized for an accident. Charlsie arrived at Fowler rehab following surgery. Both needed inpatient physical and occupational therapies along with a healthy dose of Fowler's latest high tech therapy tool, MR Cube.

The first in Dallas, this new state-of-the-art piece of rehab equipment is similar to a video game. As John & Charlsie "played" games, their balance, strength, coordination and reaction time improved. While "skiing" the therapists were able to measure and track balance. While "driving race cars" they could follow and record response times. The game-like interaction made tough and potentially painful therapy sessions, fun!
