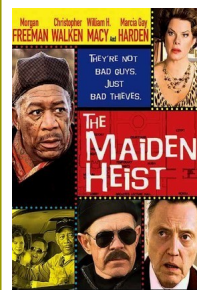

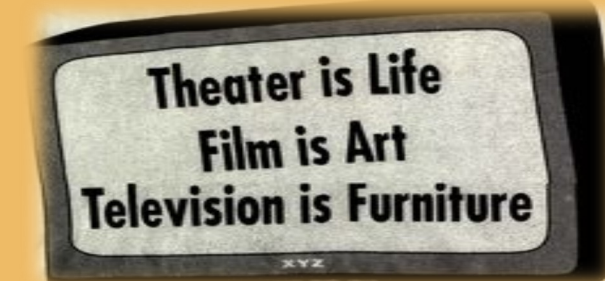
Fletcher Music presents: "The Music of Your Life" Monday, 2nd 7:45pm PAC

From the Captain

For those residents returning to The Terraces post-Hurricane Irma or from a family vacation up north, welcome home! The month of September was eventful to say the least. As we move closer toward the holiday season, the month of October brings many events, one of them being the Annual Holleran Resident Satisfaction Survey.

Although I discussed the Holleran Survey during the September Town Hall, this survey is only conducted once a year and is an important tool that provides the Leadership team with a snapshot of the community. As I mentioned, we all receive surveys when we purchase goods and services like new cars, appliances, and even new dress shirts. The senior living industry and groups like Holleran picked up on this and determined that the sheer volume of surveys pushed on to consumers was ill-perceived. This prompted Holleran to rethink their approach to surveys for seniors to ensure a high level of participation and prevent survey fatigue. This by definition occurs when respondents become bored, tired or uninterested in a survey and either fail to finish or rush through leading to a less than favorable response. This year's survey is redesigned to focus on a term called Resident Engagement, specifically how well the Terraces supports successful aging of our residents. Overall, the number of questions have been cut in half and allows The Terraces to focus on a resident's engagement within the community, with others, with their life goals and also their health & wellness.

Surveys will be placed in your in-house mail box on October 9th and should be completed and placed in the USPS mail box no later than October 20th. Couples will receive two surveys. Any residents who are out of the community will receive a survey via mail. I want to remind residents that all surveys are confidential. Last year our participation rate for Independent and Assisted Living were both around 83%. I believe this is a number we can beat this year!

As you make your way through the survey, I want residents to think about their experience at The Terraces for the entire year. If you've experienced overall great service from our Maintenance Department or Concierge staff, or any department for that matter, praise them for a job well done! We look forward to serving you, your family and guests while at The Terraces.
