Naomi was born in 1918, on a farm near Falnes Lutheran Church, in the Langford/ Pierpont area of South Dakota. Naomi shares her story



of getting married to Russ Alexander in 1939, moving to California, and working on bombers during WWII. Russell enlisted in the Navy after the bombing at Pearl Harbor in 1942. When he shipped out, Naomi stayed in California and began working at North American Aviation. She worked on the B25 Bomber and P51 Mustang. Naomi worked on the final assembly, autopilot and inspections in the cock pit. Naomi took the train back to SD in 1945 and on her way home they were informed that the war was over. Russ and Naomi's daughter Linda was born in 1946. Naomi loves her family and her Norwegian heritage. She has a bunad (traditional Norwegian dress) that she wears for special events. Caregivers who are just beginning their journey may feel adult day services are for later stages of their loved one's situation. Don't wait too long... The sooner caregivers enroll their family member, the greater the benefit for all concerned. The Adult Day Health Center (ADHC) at Bethesda is the first of its kind in Northeast South Dakota. Contact us, take a tour, ask questions, observe and schedule a day of free respite. The individualized services can actually enhance your relationship with your loved one, and improve their day-to-day experiences.

Feeling isolated can be an unwelcome side effect for family caregivers and loved ones. The ADHC reaches out to both individuals and family caregivers, creating a solid atmosphere of support. The miracle of connection with others can be expanded to include resources,

information and community caregiver support groups.

The Adult Day Health Center at Bethesda focuses on caring. Members are offered a place to enjoy the day with an emphasis on retaining self esteem and dignity. Activities will span the range of each member's interests and abilities. The ADHC also provides door-to-door, roundtrip transportation. The bus is equipped with a lift and can accommodate people with wheelchairs, walkers or canes. Physical, occupational and speech therapy is available at the Bethesda Therapy Center and the warm water therapy pool can be part of a member's weekly schedule.

The ADHC is an enhancement to the journey of caregivers and loved ones. Family members can enjoy a sense of security knowing that their loved one is receiving exceptional care. Loved ones can develop a life outside the home that is interesting, fun and safe. Adult Day Health Services can delay or eliminate placement in a long-term care facility. The ADHC is a preferred and affordable option. Additional in-home care services are also available through Bethesda In-Home Community Services.

Stress reduction may be the apparent bonus, but the joy of seeing a loved one interact with others can improve everyone's overall outlook. Even the "normal" aging process has its progressive side, but the ADHC and Bethesda In-Home Community Services can become a restorative force in a loved one's journey.

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# **Beat the Bug!**

The flu season is upon us! Protect yourself and the residents by getting your influenza vaccine this fall! Residents in the nursing home will be receiving the influenza vaccine around October 17th. Please refrain from visiting your loved ones in the nursing home if you are not feeling well yourself. The elderly are at a higher risk of contracting an illness due to their weakened immune systems.

If you must still visit we encourage you to please wear a mask (located at the front desk). Symptoms of influenza include: fever\*, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, fatigue, and some people may experience vomiting and diarrhea; however, this is more common in children than adults. Some cases are mild to severe and can result in hospitalization or even death. (\*It is important to note that not everyone with the flu will have a fever.)

The best way to prevent the spread of influenza, aside from receiving the influenza vaccine, is to wash your hands and cover your mouth when coughing and/or sneezing. Washing your hands with soap and warm water for 20 seconds or the amount of time it takes to sing the "ABCs" is the best practice. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends everyone over the age of 6 months to receive the Influenza vaccine every season, and preferably before the end of October.
