SCAM ALERT

The Federal Trade Commission has established a website online which is updated regularly with data and information on circulating scams and even notes specific, targeted areas. The website is *ftc.gov/data*.

Scams To Watch For - Several residents at the BSTE campus received a card from the US Postal Service noting their address had been changed. This was done without the residents' knowledge. The

US Postal Service is investigating this as a scam attempt. A scammer sends an address change for someone to the US Postal Service and when mail is forwarded to the new address, the scammer often receives banking and other personal information to be used illegally. If you get a note from the US Postal Service notifying your address has been changed, when in fact it has not, contact the US Postal Service immediately. If you have problems with the process of contacting the Postal Service, contact Wellness or Resident Services for assistance.

After serving the residents of Blue Skies of Texas East for nearly four years, The Nix has made a difficult decision to consolidate services and close the East campus clinic on **Tuesday**, **Feb 5**, 2019. The decision to consolidate clinic services was based on patient volume. The Nix will continue operations on the West campus, and Blue Skies bus transportation from East to West will be available for those who choose to remain with the Nix Clinic.

Blue Skies of Texas offers a variety of primary care, specialty care and ancillary support clinic options at both campuses, and we will continue to recruit providers to deliver services on campus, when feasible, in an effort to provide you the convenience of onsite medical services. While all services are not available at both campuses, bus transportation between campuses makes it possible to take advantage of the many on-site services while avoiding busy San Antonio traffic.
