## Resident Profile: Clyde and Faye Wooldridge

Writer, historian, teacher, pastor, researcher, speech therapist, book seller, friend, parents, grandparents and probably a few other labels might begin to introduce this couple. Those of us who live in Baptist Village of Oklahoma City welcome them to our community and enjoy getting acquainted with them. Clyde spoke to the group gathered for the Friendship Luncheon recently. His presentation on genealogy created interest for many of his listeners. He may hold the title “retired,” but he is still teaching at a variety of establishments around the city as well as the wider area of Oklahoma.

Clyde and Faye have been married for 48 years and have one son who coaches basketball at Bethany High school. They enjoy time with two grandsons and one granddaughter, whom they identify as their “little princess.”

One of their ministries was owning a bookstore selling Christian materials. This venture began in their home and grew to provide books for many people over a 10-year period. Sometimes they probably spent as much time and effort talking with and listening to people as they did ringing the cash register. What a wonderful way of ministering to neighbors, friends, and those who heard about them “through the grapevine” to quote a familiar saying!

Clyde sometimes served as a bi-vocational pastor at various times while continuing with his fulltime profession of coaching sports teams while also teaching history in public schools. Lest you think that means that he asked students to “just” memorize dates and places, be aware that he required much deeper thinking than that. His students were asked to think about the meanings of decisions people made in their time and location. (H-m-m, does that seem like maybe he was teaching about much more than the past?) Perhaps he was leading students to think about their own contributions to history and their place in the world.” In addition to these activities, Clyde served in The Army National Guard for seven years.

Faye often found herself “keeping the home fires burning” while pursuing her own career as a speech therapist and enjoying grandchildren. If you find yourself “needing a hug,” this lady is great at providing just what you need.

When asked what they did for fun, Clyde answered, “basketball and history.” When asked the next question, “What era of history?” his answer: “all of them.” One of the things he is presently working on is writing a history of the city of Shawnee, Oklahoma. This history is so detailed that he is writing a separate book for each 10-year time segment. When not writing, Clyde loves teaching! Sometimes the subject may include Bible studies, genealogy or history.

Becoming involved with life enrichment here at the Village is one of their goals for the coming months. Clyde described this as, “falling into place,” loving your neighbor, getting acquainted with opportunities for service as well as friendship. Their open, loving attitude shines through most conversations with them. Teacher/friend/fellow resident of BVC could be considered “Labels” that may become a way of “getting acquainted with your new best friend.”
