LOURDES' 2017 LEGACY EVENT

Lourdes Senior Community celebrated its past, present and future at our Legacy Event, Saturday, September 23rd at the Detroit Marriot in Troy, Michigan.

The event began with Mass celebrated by Monsignor Ricardo Bass of the Archdiocese of Detroit. A reception and dinner presentation followed, honoring two individuals who have embodied the mission of Lourdes through their time, talent, and treasures.

Adam Cardinal Maida, Archbishop Emeritus of the Archdiocese of Detroit was awarded the St. Dominic Leadership Award for his guidance and support, benefiting the lives of today's residents and families, as well as those in the future.

Adam Cardinal Maida was appointed Archbishop of Detroit in 1990 and was later elevated to the Sacred College of Cardinals as Cardinal-Priest of Ss. Vitale, Valeria, Gervasio e Protasio in November of 1994. Throughout his ministry, Adam Cardinal Maida has served as Vice Chancellor and General Counsel of

the Diocese of Pittsburgh, President of the Canon Law Society of America, and was a member of the Diocesan Tribunal and Chaplain of the St. Thomas More Society. His devotion and faith have touched the lives of many. However it is his affability, sincerity and compassion that endear him to those he has served.

Cardinal Maida advised the Dominican Health Care Board, serving as the Board Chair. His vision provided Lourdes with leadership through many projects, including the construction of Clausen Manor and Joseph T. Mendelson Home. His commitment enhanced quality senior living and transitioned Lourdes from a skilled nursing facility to a continuing care community.

Adam Cardinal Maida dedicated and blessed both Clausen Manor and Mendelson Home stating, "to undertake a project such as this is truly an act of faith." Cardinal Maida's leadership and vision aided Lourdes Senior Community in their quest to provide individualized care to over 250 residents who call Lourdes home.

Mrs. Nancy Vlasic was also honored with the St. Bernadette Spiritual Award. This award is presented to individuals who inspire others to give, enriching the lives of residents at Lourdes.

Nancy became involved with Lourdes when her mother, Irene Reuter, became a resident in 1984. Both Nancy and her sister, Ione, visited daily, bringing their mother a bowl of homemade soup. From the love

she had for her mother and the

time she spent at Lourdes, Nancy experienced how a small act of kindness could enhance the lives of seniors in long-term care. When the Lourdes' Guild was re-established in 1985, Nancy became a founding member.

The primary goal of the Lourdes' Guild was to "promote morale within the nursing home and aid the staff in caring for residents." The Guild planned activities such as movie nights, family picnics, and holiday parties. They also organized fund raisers. They held card parties, sponsored bake sales, sold wrapping paper for the holidays and planned talent and fashion shows.

Over the twenty years the Lourdes' Guild was active, the group purchased items of comfort as well as equipment, including warming lamps, massage tables, patient lifts and recliner chairs. They were also responsible for numerous entertainment purchases.

Through the years, Nancy's involvement with Lourdes led to the Vlasic family's support of major projects, community outreach and education, such programs include Opening Minds through Art (OMA).

Both Adam Cardinal Maida and Mrs. Nancy Vlasic were honored with a Waterford Crystal cross from Waterford, Ireland. We thank them for all of their service, support, kindness and generosity. Their contributions to the resident's lives is an immeasurable part of the *Legacy of Lourdes*.

National Assisted Living week was observed September 10th through the 16th this year. At Mendelson Home, residents celebrated with other senior living communities across the country. The theme was "Family is Forever" and was inspired by a quote from Maya Angelou, an American poet and civil rights activist. Her inspirational words define family as chosen relationships. She states:

Family isn't always about blood, it's the people in your life who want you in theirs: the ones who accept you for who you are, and the ones who would do anything to see you smile and love you no matter what.

For those living in an assisted living community, there are perhaps no better words to describe the connections formed between residents, family and staff. At Mendelson home, and across all of Lourdes Senior Community, the bonds formed have a meaningful impact on both seniors and those who care for them.

"Everyone here feels like family," said Deana Wiegand, Activity Director at Mendelson Home. "There is a great dynamic here and it makes a difference in our experience as caregivers.

We're here for the residents. That's

our priority. But we're also forming relationships and friendships that are very rewarding."

Many of the residents feel the same way.

"They take such great care of us here," said Patti Bean, Mendelson resident. "I feel very spoiled being here. I consider this my home. I don't feel away from home."

The relationships between residents and staff create a comfortable, homelike atmosphere that encourages residents to get involved, and builds confidence. But perhaps even more important is the bond formed between the residents.

"What I've noticed is that the residents here make lasting friendships and connections," said Deana. "They look out for each other. They sign each other up for outings and save seats. When new residents arrive, our seniors make sure to introduce themselves and invite the new residents into group activities. Everyone is so friendly and welcoming."

To show their support for Assisted Living Week, Mendelson residents participated in a series of activities centered around family, including crafts, games and family focused skits at Senior theater.

"We did two skits," said Lexi Boyd, Activity Assistant at Mendelson Home. "For the first we focused on family values. The second was a family vacation drama and is about overcoming trials as a family."

The skit was set in Florida during a storm they named "Hurricane Deana" after their Activity Director. Throughout the show, the cast experience trials, setbacks and many disagreements, but still find a way to come together in the end.

"The idea was that even in hard times family can still overcome the storm by working together," said Lexi.

For their weekly crafts, residents created a fall family wreath. Leaves were cut from autumn colored paper, on which residents wrote the names of those they considered family.

They also designed scrapbooks with family photos. While some residents brought pictures from personal albums, many also used photos of their friends at Mendelson Home, as well as staff.

"It was a great week of reflection and inspiring to think about," said Deana. "Not every one here has family who are able to visit often. Their friends here, and those of us who care for them, we become their family. And they're ours."
