

## JUNETEENTH

Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States. Dating back to 1865, it was on June 19th that the Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free. Note that this was two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation - which had become official January 1, 1863. The Emancipation Proclamation had little impact on the Texans due to the minimal number of Union troops to enforce the new Executive Order. However, with the surrender of General Lee in April of 1865, and the arrival of General Granger's regiment, the forces were finally strong enough to influence and overcome the resistance.

Later attempts to explain this two and a half year delay in the receipt of this important news have yielded several versions that have been handed down through the years. Often told is the story of a messenger who was murdered on his way to Texas with the news of freedom. Another, is that the news was deliberately withheld by the enslavers to maintain the labor force on the plantations. And still another, is that federal troops actually waited for the slave owners to reap the benefits of one last cotton harvest before going to Texas to enforce the Emancipation Proclamation. All of which, or neither of these version could be true. Certainly, for some, President Lincoln's authority over the rebellious states was in question. For whatever the reasons, conditions in Texas remained status quo well beyond what was statutory. General Order Number 3

One of General Granger's first orders of business was to read to the people of Texas, General Order Number 3 which began most significantly with:

"The people of Texas are informed that in accordance with a Proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and free laborer."

The reactions to this profound news ranged from pure shock to immediate jubilation. While many lingered to learn of this new employer to employee relationship, many left before these offers were completely off the lips of their former 'masters' - attesting to the varying conditions on the plantations and the realization of freedom. Even with nowhere to go, many felt that leaving the plantation would be their first grasp of freedom. North was a logical destination and for many it represented true freedom, while the desire to reach family members in neighboring states drove the some into Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma. Settling into these new areas as free men and women brought on new realities and the challenges of establishing a heretofore non-existent status for black people in America. Recounting the memories of that great day in June of 1865 and its festivities would serve as motivation as well as a release from the growing pressures encountered in their new territory. The celebration of June 19th was coined "Juneteenth" and grew with more participation from descendants. The Juneteenth celebration was a time for reassuring each other, for praying and for gathering remaining family members. Juneteenth continued to be highly revered in Texas decades later, with many former slaves and descendants making an annual pilgrimage back to Galveston on this date.

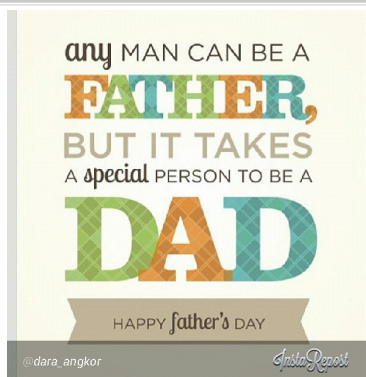

Gather 'round the grill and toast Dad for Father's Day—the national holiday so awesome that Americans have celebrated it for more than a century. Here are 15 Dad facts you can wow him with today.

1. Halsey Taylor invented the drinking fountain in 1912 as a tribute to his father, who succumbed to typhoid fever after drinking from a contaminated public water supply in 1896.
2. George Washington, the celebrated father of our country, had no children of his own. A 2004 study suggested that a type of tuberculosis that Washington contracted in childhood may have rendered him sterile. He did adopt the two children from Martha Custis's first marriage.

### Open Letter to President Obama Use Libraries as Job Incubators By David Britton and Topsy N. Smalley 02-02-10

Dear President Obama:

A group of citizens, business and entrepreneurial experts, and some librarians have been pitching ideas about organizing and energizing efforts to help regenerate the American economy. We would like to draw your attention to a grass-roots business model to create millions of sustainable jobs. We call for fast-track action for jobs, combined with ecological solutions in 2010.

Remembering the Works Progress Administration (WPA) of the 1930s, we propose a Library Progress Administration (LPA). The overarching idea is to integrate libraries as the centerpiece of efforts to generate large numbers of low cost and small-scale entrepreneur businesses. Across America, public libraries offer infrastructure to support mentoring startup entrepreneurs and existing businesses. The library hub is a civic "change" platform for integrating solutions for jobs and climate change.

Public libraries can focus on an energized connection with their home communities and become central hubs for mobilizing the mentoring of entrepreneurs, both out of work citizens and college graduates. Public libraries provide open spaces, computers, wireless environments, print and electronic materials, access to the Internet, public hours, photocopiers, printers, and places to sit and read and meet with others. Best of all, librarians are trained professionals who can connect people with the information they need to become entrepreneurs.

The LPA effort would be supported by organizations that are already in the community and are already organized specifically to educate and mentor entrepreneurs through the business startup process. Specifically the SBA, SCORE and SBDC organizations are already working to create business and civic jobs. These organizations already provide library workshops.

SCORE has a program with this aim: "To respond proactively and positively to the current economic crisis, SCORE has challenged itself to achieve a stretch goal of harnessing Americas entrepreneurial spirit to create a million successful small businesses in the next five years, one business at a time."

Goldman Sachs has committed \$500 million to launch a 10,000 Small Businesses Initiative.

**Our Business Model Abstract:** We can improve lives by mobilizing the mentoring power by using public libraries to create a Library Progress Administration. The Library hub infrastructure has the basic facilities, services, and installations needed to create sustainable jobs by mobilizing entrepreneurial mentoring services. We seek underutilized learning space in community libraries to create ecological-entrepreneur job opportunities. By providing access to entrepreneur mentoring and by localizing the innovation process, we can create better communities. We will regenerate our local economy through growing entrepreneur startups. Entrepreneurs can provide the innovations needed to build clean-technology startup organizations. The opportunity is not to build the rare high-risk scaling organization but to quickly build innovative entrepreneurial startups. Startups will help solve ecological and employment problems that threaten our very existence.

There are 435 Congressional districts in the USA. If we begin by funding one of the public libraries in these districts, specifically for a Library Progress Administration, it would take only \$435 million and less than a year to get results. The public library infrastructure is currently in place. SBA/SCORE needs another \$70 million to complete its effort to create 1 million new businesses. Our local organization needs \$1 million to establish our pilot program in Santa Cruz County, California.

Our current goal is to model our pilot business plan in a public library that is being built or refurbished in this area. To bring this jobs program nationwide we need your help to finance the Library Progress Administration model and quickly support our pilot program efforts. SBA/SCORE already has its nationwide business plan in-place to create 1,000,000 new businesses and many more jobs in the next 6 years. Attached is our Library vision video and summary plan.

Mr. President, thank you for you consideration and concern for job creation.
