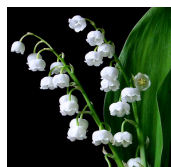
NURSES' WEEK 6-12

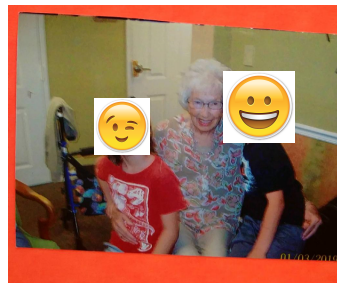
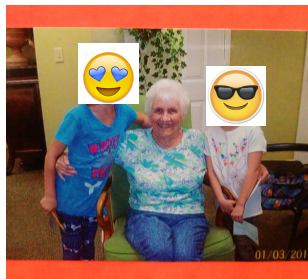
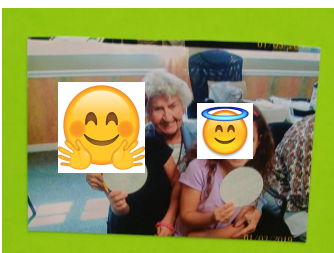


OAK MANOR & ANONA "GRANDPAL" PROGRAM

MOTHER'S DAY

1. Mother's Day is the third most popular holiday in the world, behind only Christmas and Easter.
2. According to the Pew Research Center, more phone calls are made on Mother's Day than any other day of the year.
3. A research study conducted by Nancy Etcoff, Ph.D., of Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard Medical School, found that flowers affect human behavior and make people feel happier and more compassionate around fresh-cut blooms.
4. Approximately 65% of all greeting card sales occur in the last five days before Mother's Day.
5. Women purchase 80% of all Mother's Day cards.
6. In what was formerly Yugoslavia, children would tie up their mother on Mother's Day. The only way she could be freed would be to "pay" her children with candy and treats.
7. Anna Jarvis is considered the founder of Mother's Day in the United States. She quit her job to focus full-time on persuading politicians, business executives and civic leaders into making the holiday official. On May 8, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a Joint Resolution designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day thanks to the persistence of Jarvis. Jarvis never married nor had children of her own.
8. Around one-quarter of all flowers purchased throughout the year are purchased for Mother's Day.
9. Many of the trademark sweaters that Mr. Rogers wore on his television show, Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood, were knitted by his real mother.
10. Mother's Day was intended to be a day to honor mothers individually and not collectively, thus the reason for the apostrophe before the "s" – making it singular possessive instead of plural possessive.
11. Mother's Day is the busiest day of the year for the restaurant industry with 62% of Americans dining
12. Mother's Day sees around one quarter of all flowers purchased throughout the year falling on this holiday.
13. Carnations are very popular flowers for Mother's Day and are thought to be made from the tears of Jesus' mother (Mary) when she wept at his feet the day He was crucified.
14. Pink and red carnations are given to mother's that are still alive, while white ones are for those that have passed away.
15. In the vast majority of the world's languages, the word for "mother" begins with the letter M.
16. In 1939 in Lima, Peru, the youngest mother on record delivered a baby boy by C-section. She was only 5 years-old and the baby was raised as her brother.
17. On the flip-side, the oldest woman to deliver a baby was recorded on April 9, 2003. Her name is, Satyabhama Mahapatra, and is a 65-year-old retired schoolteacher in India. She gave birth to a baby boy, which was her first child after 50 years of marriage. However, the eggs were donated by her 26 year-old niece.
18. Before Octomom (Nadya Suleman) Bobbie McCaughey had septuplets – four boys and three girls – on November 19, 1997. The babies were born via C-section after 31 weeks.
19. The shortest span between two babies is by mom, Jayne Bleackley. She gave birth to her son on September 3, 1999. Then only 208 days later gave birth to her daughter (on March 30, 2000).
20. Elizabeth Ann Buttler gives a whole new meaning to second family. She gave birth to her first child (a girl) May 19, 1956. Then when she was 60 years-old, she gave birth to her son on November 20, 1997, making the babies 41 years 185 days apart.
21. Common Mother's Day gifts include: cards, flowers, meals in restaurants, jewelry, gift cards, clothing, trips to a spa, books, CDs, housewares and even gardening tools
