Because Eva cried and screamed while her mother was being taken away, the soldiers softened and reunited them. Shortly after, Eva and her mother left their home and most of their belongings and were sent to Germany. There they were joined with Eva's dad

after the war and continued to live in Germany for a few years. When Eva was a teenager, they were sponsored by a family and moved to Taylor, Missouri. Learning English was challenging, but Eva succeeded. Because they knew of relatives in the area, they moved to Akron, Ohio and Eva graduated from Buchtel High School in 1956. After high school she worked as a secretary for Ohio Edison. She often went to German American Club with girls from work which is where she met her husband, Fred Grawunder. Fred moved to America from Germany before the Berlin Wall was built. He settled in Ohio and easily found a job at Chrysler due to his good training in Germany. They were married on March 16, 1963 and had three daughters: Monica (Bill) Bauman, (owners of Bauman Orchards), Susie (Mike) Walder, (missionaries in Haiti), and Jodi (Andy) Lovell, (stay-at-home Mom and manufacturing manager at Swagelok in Solon, Ohio). They also have eleven grandchildren and two great-

grandchildren. About 48 years ago Fred and Eva were baptized in the Akron Apostolic Christian Church. Most of all, Eva enjoys spending time with her husband, children and grandchildren. Some of her other hobbies are gardening, canning hot peppers, making nut tortes and a daily reading of the newspaper. She has always had a friendly nature and hospitable heart. After being married for 56 years, it is still a joy to see Eva and Fred visiting together when Fred comes to see her from his apartment behind the home.
