#### **INSIDE STORY FROM VANESSA**

Thank you to all those that voted for the new slate of Resident Advisory Committee (RAC) members. These volunteers are your voice for suggestions and issues that affect life at UV. The new members are Beverly Hudgens, Chair, Cecelia Basarich, Betty Wolfe, Don Berry, Frankie Overton, Gus Delaloye and Jerry Nixon. You can submit suggestions via the suggestion box located on the north side of the circle lounge or you can discuss it with one of the RAC members. The members and I will discuss the suggestions the second Monday of each month, then someone will follow up with you to let you know how and if we can implement your suggestion.

We're making some changes to the staffing structure in our maintenance department. Some of the schedules have changed to provide more coverage throughout the week. We will now have 7-day per week maintenance staff on-site and our staff will continue rotating to cover the after-hours calls.

University Village provides transportation to doctor, dental and vision appointments for our residents. Transports are limited to one per week. As of June 1, we are increasing our transport area to include St. John's Broken Arrow and the physician's building located on the same property. If you would like to schedule transportation to an appointment, you can call Keith in Resident Services (x3269). Please call at least two weeks prior to your appointment date.

Fortunately, UV was not affected by the rising waters in May. However, it was a good opportunity for us to practice our emergency preparedness plans related to floods. University Village has an agreement with the Cityplex Towers for temporary housing in case we needed to do a quick evacuation. We also have agreements with eight other senior communities as well as a local hotel in case we needed to evacuate for longer periods of time. For safety reasons though, we will always try to shelter-in-place first. UV keeps enough non-perishable food items to last seven days. We have enough perishable food items to last three days. We keep back-up water on hand and we have a contract with Culligan Water to bring us enough drinkable water for all residents and staff. For our independent residents, we encourage you to always keep at least seven days' worth of medications on hand. If you need food items like milk, bread or eggs, you can purchase them from our dining services department. For any questions related to our emergency plans, don't hesitate to ask. You can also read about our emergency plans on our website (www.uvrc.com) and some information is contained in your Resident Handbook.

To reduce the number of telemarketing calls, you can register your phone number with the Federal Trade Commission's National Do Not Call Registry. Registration is free and can be done by visiting their website (www.donotcall.com) or by calling 888-382-1222 from the phone number you wish to register.

If you would like to submit a suggestion that could benefit the residents of UV, please submit your suggestion on the form provided on the north side of the circle lounge. You must include your name for your suggestion to be considered.
